## That God-shaped hole in each of our hearts....

Man has a restless heart- it will not be content apart from God and Christ.

In the mid-1600's Blaise Pascal- a Christian mathematician, scientist, inventor, and writer, wrote this about the problem of mankind's restless heart:

"What else does this craving, and this helplessness, proclaim but that there was once in man a true happiness, of which all that now remains is the empty print and trace?"

This he tries in vain to fill with everything around him, seeking in things that are not there the help he cannot find in those that are, though none can help, since this infinite abyss can be filled only with an infinite and immutable object; in other words by God himself"

The psalmist affirms this principle when he wrote: "*As the deer pants for streams of water, so my soul pants for you, my God.*"

## Meditations

Wikipedia defines a meditation as “a practice where an individual focuses their mind on a particular object, thought or activity to achieve a mentally clear and emotionally calm state.”

Normally, our meditations are given by men of the church during the Lord’s Supper (Communion) and Offering. These men have thought about what it should mean for us to be able to share in the bread and the juice which represents Jesus’ sacrifice; and in our financial support of the church’s ministry.

In speaking about our faithful contributions to the finances of the church, the apostle Paul has this to say: “This service you perform is not only supplying the needs of the Lord’s people but is also overflowing in many expressions of thanks to God. Because of the service by which you have proved yourselves, others will praise God for the obedience that accompanies your confession of the gospel of Christ, and for your generosity in sharing with them and with everyone else. An in their prayers for you their hearts will go out to you, because of the surpassing grace God has given you”- 2 Cor. 9: 12-14.

So, in both the Lord’s Supper and in the Offering, it is the Lord who supplies our needs. Yes, we are to participate; yet, it is still His work in and through us!

For example, God would tell the men of Israel that they appeared before Him, but they were not to come “empty-handed” (Deut. 16:16). Why? Because, just as with us, God was their supplier- and they were to bring a portion back to Him as a testimony of how He had taken care of them.

And how much more true is this for us today!
