The word of God- seed for the soul



"The *seed* in the good soil, these are the ones who have heard the word in an honest and good heart, and hold it fast, and bear fruit with perseverance"- **Luke 8:15.**

By definition, a **parable** is a simple story using common everyday events to illustrate a moral or spiritual lesson, as told by Jesus in the Gospels.

Jesus' parable of the soils

⁴ When a large crowd was coming together, and those from the various cities were journeying to Him, He spoke by way of a parable: ⁵ "The sower went out to sow his seed; and as he sowed, some fell beside the road, and it was trampled underfoot and the birds of the air ate it up. ⁶ Other *seed* fell on rocky *soil*, and as soon as it grew up, it withered away, because it had no moisture. ⁷ Other *seed* fell among the thorns; and the thorns grew up with it and choked it out. ⁸ Other *seed* fell into the good soil, and grew up, and produced a crop a hundred times as great." As He said these things, He would call out, "He who has ears to hear, let him hear."

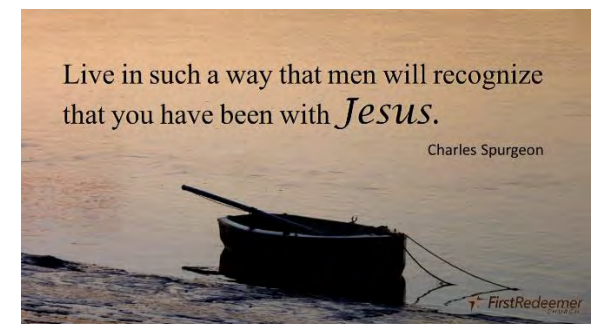
⁹ His disciples *began* questioning Him as to what this parable meant. ¹⁰ And He said, "To you it has been granted to know the mysteries of the kingdom of God, but to the rest *it is* in parables, so that SEEING THEY MAY NOT SEE, AND HEARING THEY MAY NOT UNDERSTAND.

¹¹ "Now the parable is this: the seed is the word of God. ¹² Those beside the road are those who have heard; then the devil

comes and takes away the word from their heart, so that they will not believe and be saved. ¹³ Those on the rocky *soil are* those who, when they hear, receive the word with joy; and these have no *firm* root; they believe for a while, and in time of temptation fall away. ¹⁴ The *seed* which fell among the thorns, these are the ones who have heard, and as they go on their way they are choked with worries and riches and pleasures of *this* life, and bring no fruit to maturity. ¹⁵ But the *seed* in the good soil, these are the ones who have heard the word in an honest and good heart, and hold it fast, and bear fruit with perseverance- **Luke 8:4-15, NASB.**

We need to stop and ask ourselves which kind of soil we are- packed-down like a trail, or a hard rocky spot, or thistle loaded, or are we the good soil? The evidence is seen in how God's word is working in our lives.
